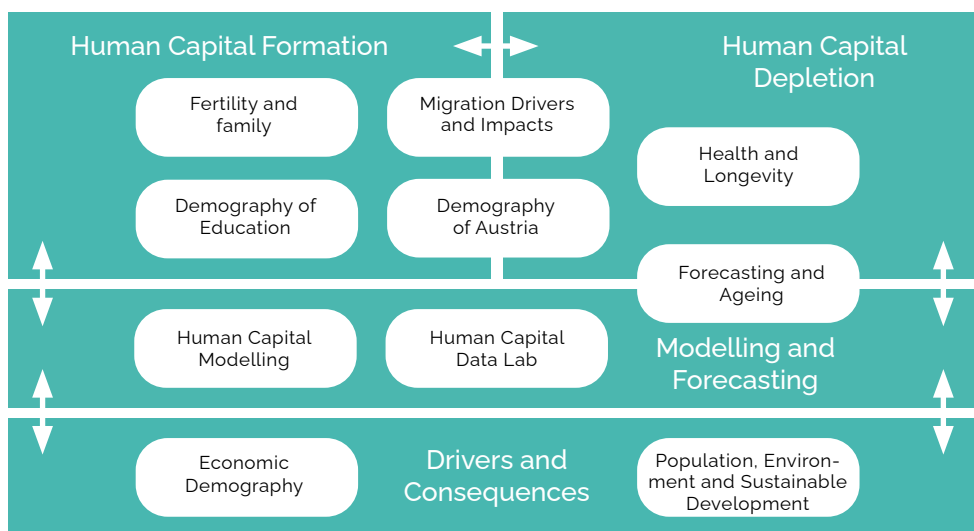
The Wittgenstein Centre for Demography and Global Human Capital is a collaboration among the Austrian Academy of Sciences (OeAW), the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis (IIASA) and the University of Vienna. The Centre combines the partners' strengths in the field of demography, with the aim to advance demographic methods and their application to the analy-

sis of human capital and population dynamics. Understanding the drivers and consequences of changing population structures around the world and how they affect human wellbeing and societies as a whole, as well as the provision and analysis of demographic data, and the communication of these findings to a global public, are at the heart of the centre's work.

63 scientists from 22 countries work together at the Wittgenstein Centre.

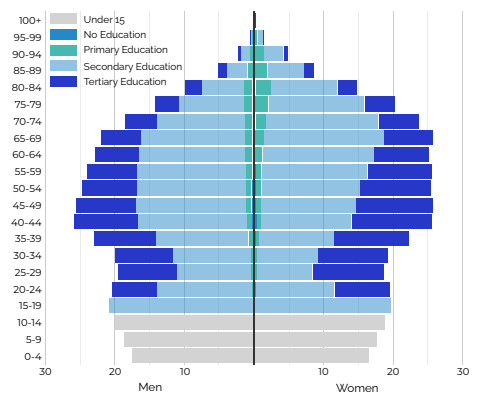
Human capital refers to the human resource base in terms of the number of people and their changing structure by relevant characteristics such as age, gender, education, and health status.
